

Snowman Sock

Materials:

white tube sock
flat lid jar (like used for canning)
fiberfill
bird seed
twine
scrap material for scarf
buttons
permanant marker
orange toothpick
hot glue

Directions

Turn tube sock inside out so the bumpy part of the sock is on the outside. This makes for great texture to the snowman to make him look more like snow. Place the flat jar lid in the bottom of the snowman. Place bird seed or sand in a small baggie and secure. Place the baggie on top of the lid in the sock to give the snowman some weight. This allows him to stand without falling over. Next stuff your snowman with the fiberfill. Take the scrap material to make a scarf around the snowmans neck. Next fold over the top part of the tube sock to make a hat for your snowman. Tie a bow with twine on around the hat. Next hot glue on 3 buttons down the snowman's body. Finally let the kids draw a face on their snowman with the permanent marker...and don't forget the carrot nose...it's an orange toothpick that will easily slide into the sock!

Great project for young kids. I did this with the kindergartners and they did a wonderful job on their own!
